This is a REAL U.S. Passport

Because of International Conventions almost all passports are constructed similarly – with the same requirements for elements and information.

U.S. Passports are the most commonly faked by scammers.

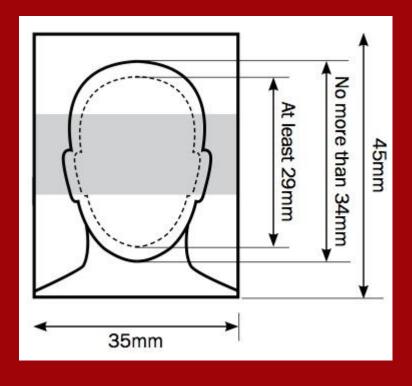
Passport Photo





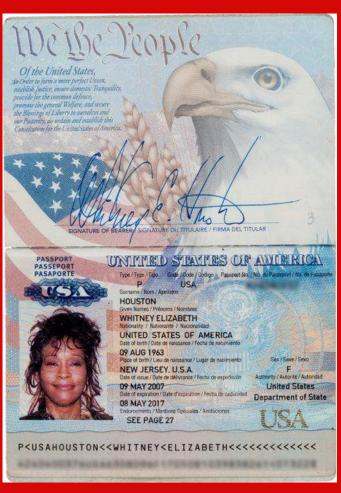
A passport photo must follow international standards

- Face to the front
- Full face
- Show ear
- Size of head
- Proportions In photo
- Light plain or transparent Background
- No complex background
- Logo/Graphics overlap
- No border
- Rectangular shape
- Might be second photo on some countries passports
- Perfectly in focus



Passport Signature





Passports allow free-form signatures

- Signature in blue or black ink
- A real signature not printed text
- May be on main page or on facing page
- May be any size
- Should match the name printed on the passport since both are the legal name of the passport holder
- Unaltered blackground clearly showing under the signature

Passport Text





Passports have pre-printed and typed printed text (holder's information)

- Pre-printed text can be any color typically consistent with the passport coloration
- Printed personal information shoup always be black ink
- All printed text should be the same font shape and size
- Main information should be printed fully aligned like in example
- Printed text is designed to be read by scanners so must be clear sans serif type font
- Passport number may be different size

Passport Language





Passports will have their language in English and the language of the country of origin

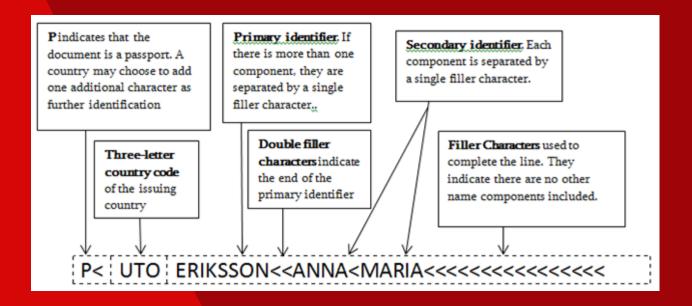
- All of the data and fields will be in Roman Type Face for international travel passports
- Some countries have internal passports in their native language
- Will be native language first in pre-printed text and then English
- U.S. Passports show English, French, and Spanish preprinted text

Passport Bottom Text



Passports have machine readable data at the bottom


- Uses distinctive machine readable font
- Two rows one for name, one for passport number
- Strictly roman characters Ñ would be N, Ü would be U
- Name must match text above
- Passport number must match number above





Quick Guide How To Spot A Fake U.S. Passport

- 1: Signature Does Not Match Fake Name
- 2: Fake Photo Has A Background You Can See Original Photo Showing Under New Fake Photo
- 3: Type Font Not The Same (Look At "G"s)
- 4: Fake & Original Text Color Not The Same
- 5: Original Passport Text Is Not Same
- 6: Check If Text Does Not Align With Original
- 🄭 Bottom Text Does't Align With Page Edge
